2012 Wild Shiners Have a Ball

Let's face it, fear can be immobilizing, or it can be a great motivator. Ask any zebra. But fear in humans more often than not is the former. Take for example the Wild Shiner Ball coming up on Friday, February 10 in the gym at Webber University in Babson Park, FL. This mischief has been carrying on for a quarter century now.

The Wild Shiner Black-Light Ball always features non-stop live (bait) music. This year the music will be generated by two classic rock bands, Junior & the MDs and Station 6. Starting at 8:00 pm via an ingenious method known as "leap-frogging," the bands never allow a break in the music until the Exalted Ruler pulls the plug around midnight. This consistently results in a darned good party and severely exhausted dancers. Another ingenious innovation of the Shiner Ball is the allowance of BYOC, which can be best be deciphered to mean "bring your own cooler," although some participants have translated it to "bring your own chauffeur." The former translation puts the burden of selecting the beverage of choice squarely on the shoulder of the attendee or group of attendees, and is not too dissimilar to the better known concept of "tailgating."
